

ACTIVITIES OF JEEVAN VIKAS SANSTHA DURING THE YEAR 2019-2020

1 PROMOTING QUALITY HEALTH CARE PROGRAMME

TRAINING AND AWARENESS PROGRAM ORGANIZED IN 10 PROJECT TARGET VILLAGES

1. Awareness on prevention of sickness like

Water born diseases/Malaria/ANC and PNC Care /Anemia/Sickle Cell Anemia

Detail of the awareness program: During the six month the following awareness programs were conducted and the points were explained through flip cards, video clips, poster and charts – Water born diseases, Malaria, ANC and PNC Care, Anemia, Sickle cell Anemia, Polio myelitis. The causes, consequences and safety measures of water born diseases were explained to the community and motivated them to keep surroundings clean, drinking boiled water, avoid outside food, proper hand washing, use of built toilets for sanitation etc. We encouraged people to spread information on Malaria that Malaria is a disease caused by a parasite. The parasite is transmitted to humans through the bites of infected mosquitoes. A malaria infection is generally characterized by the following signs and symptoms: fever with chills, headache, nausea and vomiting, muscle pain and fatigue, sweating and Chest or abdominal pain and how to prevent malaria. Determine the level of risk, Stay in well-screened areas at night. Always use of mosquito nets, Use mosquito repellent, go for long sleeves. We explained them that ANC and PNC services are key health interventions for reducing maternal and newborn morbidity and mortality rate. The Components of antenatal and postnatal care. ANC Visits and referral: 1st visit: before 16 weeks of gestation, 2nd visit: from 20 to 24 weeks of gestation, 3rd visit: from 28 to 32 weeks of gestation & 4th visit: from 36 to 40 weeks of gestation, referral and follow-up should be given to pregnant women with complications. For PNC mothers we advised hygiene, warmth, breastfeeding and provision of eye prophylaxis and immunizations according to local policy. To prevent from Anemia we motivated them to prepare home remedies. We encouraged them to eat leafy vegetables like spinach, brinjal, powder of drumstick leaves, beetroot juice, kismis, tomatoes, apples etc. We told them regarding medical checkup and blood check up if symptoms persists for more days then seek Doctors assistance. We also brought awareness regarding the Sickle cell Anemia. It is a Red blood cell disorder with abnormal hemoglobin. It is "Inherited" means that the disease is passed by genes from parents to their children. SCD is not contagious. A person cannot catch it, like a cold or infection, from someone else. We advised them to eat fresh vegetables and fruits to stay fit and healthy. We also explained them about the poliomyelitis disease. It is an infectious disease caused by the poliovirus. Or poliomyelitis is a crippling and potentially deadly infectious disease. It is caused by the poliovirus. The virus spreads from person to person and can invade an infected person's brain and spinal cord, causing paralysis. Polio symptoms are fever, sore throat, headache, vomiting, fatigue, back and neck pain, arm and leg stiffness. Muscle tenderness and spasms. Diagnosis. Doctors often recognize polio by symptoms, such as neck and back stiffness, abnormal reflexes, and difficulty swallowing and breathing. The polio vaccines are necessary to prevent from poliomyelitis. We encouraged the community to vaccinate their children regularly. The project beneficiaries were also informed about benefit of drinking sufficient water, personal hygiene and cleanliness and keeping the surrounding clean to prevent the diseases. Thus 4743 people being sensitized on different diseases and their level of understanding has increased and much benefited through these awareness programs.

2. Mobile clinics

The mobile clinic was conducted in all the 10 project villages and under mobile clinic patients who were suffering from anemia, scabies, dysentery, malaria, viral fever, diarrhoea, headache etc., were treated. Because of mobile clinic 825 poor patients were treated and they were able to get quality health service facility and primary health intervention in the village itself. Patients who were suffering from the major illnesses were referred and taken to other private and govt. hospital for the better treatment. Mobile clinic was a great help for the Korku tribal community and they were able to access medical assistance during the rainy season. OPD was open for the poor patients all the times and they could easily access to OPD. In OPD 5317 patients were given better treatment.

3. World AIDS day celebration

The world AIDS day was conducted at Kara center and 10 villages. We explained them the causes, signs and symptoms, diagnosis and preventions of the disease. We motivated them to be faithful to your respective partner, safe blood transfusion and use of new syringes and needles. Once in year to do HIV test in order to remain Healthy. We advised to antenatal mothers to do blood test to protect the child and mother by getting affected from AIDS. The tribal people were ignorant about this disease but through this program many people were enlightened and motivated to keep the safety measures in order to protect themselves and remain healthy.

4. Training on Herbal medicine

5. Medical Camp

The medical camp was conducted on 29th August 2019 with the help of Doctors and their team from Kothara Community Hospital and through this medical camp 245 poor patient benefited. In this medical camp patients who were suffering from various kinds of diseases such as upper respiratory tract infection, severe anemia, gastroenteritis, scabies, dysentery, malaria, diarrhoea, received the treatment and those patients with surgical interventions were taken to Kothara Community Hospital, & Government Hospital in Dharni, Amravati, Nagpur city for the blood test and further treatment & operational surgeries. Doctors also informed patients about health and hygiene and healthy practices in their day to day life and nutritional food for their healthy life.

6. Eye Camp

The eye camp was conducted on 29th August 2019 with the help of Mr. Pramod and his team. There were 121 eye patients who were checked and they were given medicines and specks and those who had cataract problems were suggested to undergo surgery in Kothara Community Hospital. After the eye camp follow up was taken and two eye patients were taken to Hospital for the cataract surgery. Doctors from Kothara Community did the surgical operation free of cost and now the cataract eye patients are completely alright.

Medical and Surgical Intervention Patients: 13 Patients with complaints of Sickle cell Anemia, hypertension, tuberculosis, blurred vision, cerebral vascular accident etc. from Tarubandha Kara, Kesarpur, Kotha, Jambhu, Chikhli were taken to different government and private hospitals for treatment. Many of them are cured and some are on treatment and feeling better and regaining their health back.



2. Women empowerment project: N I L A

STAFF TRAINING CONDUCTED DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD

1	Monthly planning cum reporting at JVS Office with the project coordinator and Monthly Staff Meeting with the Director, Coordinator and animators
Details	As the communication and team work is very important in any field so also the regular staff meetings and trainings gave way to us to reach our common goals. Through the planned agenda and action plan for every month we could achieve our set goals. It was an opportunity for us to come together reflect on the work done, the progress and what more we need to do. It also helped us to share our skills, talents, capabilities and inspire each other to work more effectively. The meetings helped us to update on any changes regarding the work plan and the various other programmes. We could discuss and share openly about the work, various incidents, problems and it was also a time to look forward for the betterment. The meetings and the timely guidance helped to achieve our aims and objectives. We could evaluate our team work and our productivity in implementation of our plans in conducting the programmes. This has widened our knowledge and opened way to venture in to the realities with courage and confidence. Thus staff meetings gave boost to us to work more effectively.
2	Village level development plan meeting
Details	Village level development plan meetings were being conducted in the villages more effectively. This year we could motivate other women from the village to participate in the meetings and put forth their demands and submitted resolution. Through various trainings at the local level the women learned and gained knowledge right from finding out the needs of the families and community at a large. The involvement of other women increased the strength, capacity and women gained confidence to speak in public. In the meetings they could put forth the basic life needs of all the residents such as housing, water, sanitation, electricity, roads, transport and communication facilities, livelihoods, education and health facilities. Participation of the women in the meetings motivated them to take lead and speak for the voiceless women in the locality. As a result many women have got benefited from various local government schemes that were available. At times it was very challenging and disappointing to see that the meetings would get cancelled before or discontinued due fight on various issue in the Gram Panchayat. Yet the women took initiatives in many cases to call for a Woman Gram Sabha and put forth their demands. Today they have build up their self respect in the locality and able to work together for the common good.



3	Workshop for bank account opening, maintenance process
Details	We could conduct around 29 sessions on bank account opening and maintenance process in every village through LIC agents and other bank personnel. It was an opportunity for us to make them understand how important it to save money for the better future. Having bank account not only provides security but also protects them from theft and other natural disasters as they do not have safe homes. One can lead a tension free life. They were also made aware of types of bank accounts and its benefits. At the end of this year as we evaluated our work we could make sure that each woman has saving account and has learned the technique of saving. Many have LIC and started getting the benefits as the need arises.
4	SHG rejuvenation / Formation activities
Details	The Self Help groups played a dynamic role at the village level besides working in groups. They have learned the technique of earning, saving, loaning and repayment. They did not only financial management and small business initiatives but also were actively taking part at the local level whenever the village level meetings took place. They help each other to solve their problems. As a group together they have found ways and means to improve their living conditions. They have learned self governance and have expressed their desire to collectively perform common purpose. Seven groups have obtained eligibility to avail subsidized loan from the government and other groups are in the process. Through their initiatives they have managed to get the work done by the local self government at the community level too. Thus Self help groups play an active role in the villages.
5	Counseling Sessions for the stressed widows
Details	Widowhood affects the psychological wellbeing of the individual and their families. Therefore our counseling sessions were done through family visits. The regular visits helped us to build a good rapport with every family member. Thus we could bring awareness in the family members that they too contribute a lot in their family development. Visits paved way for us come to know the need and problems of the family very closely. Thus we could help them by giving them right guidance and motivation for life. We could also look into the overall development of the family such as education of children, physical health condition, social acceptance and psychological wellbeing etc. It was an opportunity for us to bridge the team between welfare organizations and government offices to avail various schemes for the family. Today they come forward and take initiatives and improved in their decision making for the family and also they have improved in their communication skills.
6	Awareness through street plays
Details	This initiative was unique and deeply meaningful, as the play was created and performed through the efforts, talents, and cooperation of school teachers and students. We could prepare children from the village schools to conduct street plays at the village level. Children took good interest in performing street plays and conveyed awareness message to them. It was presented in the crowded junctions of the villages, where the team was warmly welcomed and many people attended. We had a great support from the Village Head and Police Patil from each village. Through the play, the team was able to create awareness among the people on various topics like Farmer Suicide, Save Water, Education of Girl child, Save Girl child, Bad effects of Mobiles and Women Safety. Each topic had its own stories explaining the present and past scenario and what we should do for the better future. Thus we could educate many other people who are not directly involved with us. Through the street play we too could reach out other people of

15	School level sanitization workshops
Details	The sanitization workshops were conducted in the schools through various topics such as health and hygiene, Drinking water, Cleanliness Drive activities and essay competitions. Sessions on Health and hygiene too were conducted by the health workers in the schools along with the animators. We provided to each school "First Aid Kit". The teachers and students were so glad to receive it as it is very useful and many of the government schools have no facilities for the same. Children took rally in the villages on cleanliness drive in the villages. Through various posters we could convey messages on various topics such as Saving water, Various types of pollutions, recycling of the waste materials and save mother earth. The teachers too cooperated along with the children in concertizing people.
16	International Women's day and financial advisory counseling
Details	International women's day was celebrated on 11 th March 2019. The main invited guests of the Day were Mrs. Kalpana Kasdekar from Achalpur Panchayat samiti who is Block development officer, Mr. Devendra Petkar who the president in Panchayat Samiti and Fr. Sanjay Bodhak. Other invited guests were Village heads from various panchayats and members of Gram panchayat, teachers and health workers. The programme was planned and arranged by the Coordinator Sr. Jenifer and animators Mrs. Bharati More, Mrs. Chanda Wankhade and Mrs. Jyoti Pawar in Rasegoan. The resource persons addressed the gathering. They spoke about the importance of women in the family, society, and her role in the development of the family, society and country. Woman is the one who saves some income for the family. No matter whatever sacrifices she has to make. They also shared their knowledge about how the women should come forward in liasoning and networking. The women should not only do the saving just for tomorrow but also has to have a great vision to build a good future for the children. Therefore savings should be something keeping in mind for the bright future of the family, children, etc. The panchayat samiti has a lot of Schemes for women. Women should come forward and get maximum benefit of it. The school children also conducted various skits on "Cleanliness Drive" "Health" "Violence Against Women" and many sung songs related to women who have made a great impact in the history.
17	Poster Exhibitions
Details	Training through poster presentations were conducted in 19 villages as well as in the schools. The main topics were Save the girl child, Rights of children, Protect mother earth, Bad habits, etc. Sessions were conducted in Parents teachers meetings too. This helped us to explain to the parents and teachers their roles and responsibilities in bringing up children especially related to right to education and safety of girl children. We could also make them aware of the various Skill development trainings and extra-curricular activities such as sports, Art, dance, stitching and various competitions etc. too are very important. Parents should motivate children to learn for life rather only in academics. Thus we could explain to them through posters that which gave them much of understanding and clarity about the topics.
18	"LIGHT UP THE FLAME 2019"
Details	We could take up this event in all 19 villages though not all on the same day. In some villages we conducted it before and in some villages on that day. Women took actively part in it to show a shining trace of solidarity all around the world. It really showed each one's personal commitment to fight against poverty. It was an opportunity for us to extend this activity to the village people making them aware each one's responsibility to alleviate poverty. Many people too joined us in taking the rally in the village. We could even march with candle spreading this message to the villagers. The photos were uploaded in the social media.
19	Networking Meetings and its Results
Details	These two years of constant visits helped us as a staff to build up a good rapport with the government departments. Through our work they too came to know about how many young and old widows exist and struggle for daily living. Their cooperation and willingness to help us is really appreciative. We could not only provide training to the women but also could bring them to the door step of the government offices to work for getting their rights. The staff and the students took part in the meetings that were conducted at Gram Panchayat level or Panchayat Samiti and each time there was something new to learn and to carry forward the work. Today women are able to get the work done by themselves and have gathered courage to approach any government offices.

7	Social Welfare Schemes promotion linkage and follow up
Details	We could conduct various training programmes on social welfare schemes at village level. Our main aim was to promote social harmony, spread awareness about pro-poor initiatives of the government and reach out to the poor households and to enroll them as also to obtain various social welfare programmes. We could work on more effectively namely, Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, Saubhagya, Ujala scheme, Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana, Sukanya yojana, Indira Awas Yojana, and pension scheme. We have been able to guide them and teach them to reach every offices of the government. Majority of them have been availed schemes like pension, housing, latrine, Ujjwala Gas, poultry farming, goat rearing etc. Having learned today women not only avail these schemes for themselves but also help other women who are in need of these schemes. They have gained knowledge to where and how to approach the government offices. We are happy to see that they have been empowered and are able to speak for their rights.
8	Financial Advisory Counseling
Details	Trainings were being conducted at the village level making them understand in simple way how to manage their money. We activities and games we made them aware of worth of each rupees in day today life. We taught them about how to prioritize their needs in the family. It was an opportunity for us to teach them what are their basic needs and goals of life. As they are daily wage workers we could guide them in doing plan for the saving and expenditure every month. Thus they have learned to make a family budget and be consciously aware of saving and expenditure. Making savings in the banks or making insurance on livestock, health would help them to save money and face uncertainties in life.
9	Skill Development Linkages and follow up
Details	The socio economic development among the widows depends upon their empowerment. The Women with whom we worked are mostly engaged in agricultural activities, domestic work, animal rearing and some of them having self employment. Most of them are daily wage earners as they are less educated. We organized very many sessions on skill development through the Self Help group trainers. They conducted trainings on ornament making, Daj mill, Papad making, Knitting, tailoring, beauty parlor and other various small business initiatives that which is applicable and feasible. We could also involve the young girls of the widows as they could develop their skills and gain knowledge on various topics. Thus this has helped the families to have economic independence, self-reliance, self-confidence and leadership recognition in the village.
10	Workshop on Panchayat Raj
Details	During this reporting period we brought awareness among the widows and deserted about the Panchayat Raj system. We brought into their notice the roles and responsibilities of the Local self government towards the people of the village and community. Panchayat Raj institutions should play very vital role in the development of education, health, agriculture, women and child development and women participation in local government. We have been able to motivate the women to actively participate in all the meetings and put forth their demands. Knowing the government system is very important so that one is able to avail all the benefits and make the work of the government more effective. The local government also has realized the work of the NGO and is very supportive in every programme that is undertaken by Jeevan Vikas Sanstha.
11	Rectification and Assisting legal Documents
Details	Rectifying the legal documents and doing the follow up of the applied documents of the last year was the main task that we could do in this reporting period. Since the government of India is making it compulsory to have many documents such as Ration card, Adhar card, Election card, PAN card, Land documents, bank account, House documents etc. We could do help to maximum number of widows, deserted women and physically challenged men and women. Since this work was undertaken by us women felt socially secure and came forward to apply for the documents that they needed or do any corrections regarding mistakes in the documents. The animators guided them under the guidance of Director and Coordinator. Today many of their works have become easier as they have obtained necessary documents. Thus we have been able to build up a good relationship between government agencies and people in the village.
12	Training on Income Generation programme
Details	The small business initiatives help the rural women to generate an extra income for the family. As majority of them get involved in daily wage work or farm work that which is seasonal they find it difficult to earn their living in other times. Therefore we could motivate women as well as groups to start some income generation activities of their own like goat rearing, cow rearing, putting up a petty shop, selling of brooms, juice centre, canteen, papad making and whatever is applicable and that which could be sold in the locality. Many trainers from Panchayat Samiti offered trainings to the members of the Self Help groups assuring them availability of outlet of their products. By doing these women find themselves occupied in doing various other activities that are effective and that which would develop entrepreneurship qualities in them.
13	Liaison, Networking and Advocacy programme with the finance institute and government offices.
Details	As our work was mainly to avail the welfare schemes to the widows, deserted women that which are available from the Central Govt. and State Govt. we could do our best and do justice to the widows. Through liasoning and networking the women have come to know various government and non government offices that are working for various causes. As we have showed them the way to get linked and how and where they have to approach today they come forward by themselves and do their work. Their children too have been motivated and guided to attend the training programmes, coaching classes and do job oriented classes so that they are assured of their job and good future as they can get work the cities like Nagpur, Pune, Mumbai companies and other local companies.
14	Community level workshops to cut down stigma and discrimination
Details	This year as we worked with the women in this regard and there was a positive response from them. Having received sufficient knowledge about the Social Stigma and Social discrimination the widows have come forward to break all the barriers that hinders them to come to the forefront of the society. They take active part in all the cultural events and social activities. They have participated in the common protests and rally on various issues. At times collective support gives weightage, therefore they too accompany and help each other in their need. They too have gained their respect and empathy from the community people. Today we can see a lot of change in the communities and localities.

3. Water and Agriculture Resilience Mission (WARM)

Supported by: Caritas India

1: Context/ Executive Summary:

The target area of the proposed project falls within 4 villages of Washim District. Agriculture is the main source of livelihood for the rural community and it is mainly depending on monsoon. The 60% farmers land comes under rain fed area. For the last few years, there has been scarcity of water due to reduced rainfall and drought situation. There is no adequate water available for drinking and irrigation purpose. Marginal farmers suffer a lot because of lack of irrigation facility. There are no soil and water conservation structures that can recharge the ground water and increase the ground water level.

Since there is unseasonal rain, poor monsoon and some time drought in the area, this has affected the annual food security of the marginal farming community. The soil fertility and moisture has been degraded in the area due to heavy use of chemical fertilizers and pesticide. Thus, the land has become highly uncultivable and unproductive.

Therefore our focus intervention is to enhance the livelihood of the rural community by promotion of sustainable agriculture practices and entitlement through community. We also try to promote and practice of sustainable agriculture among the community through

resilience farming that will increase annual food security of the people. And we have developed Water friends model for the convergence of entitlements and livelihood. The project in 12 months will primarily focus on developing soil and water conservation, sustainable agriculture practices with farmers and availing entitlements for sustaining annual livelihood of the marginal families.

Context: For the last few years, as for the yearly plan four Gramsabhas were held at Panchala in the presence of Surpanch, few members, Gramsevek, Talathi's and a small group of people from four villages. People were neither aware of the importance of Gramsabha, Nor interested to attain it. Youth were totally away from the Gramsabha thinking it's only Adults meeting. Women were completely unaware of the same. On the other hand people were blaming them for not fulfilling their duties and responsibilities. People were not aware of their rights and benefits, current issues of the villages, government schemes and entitlements. Hence village's issues, difficulties and problems were not brought to Gramsabha and their expectations were not fulfilled on time.

Here comes A Ray of Hope through WARM Mission. Though WARM intervention we formed Village Development Committee, Men Farmers groups, Women Farmers groups, Water friends groups, SHG groups in the four villages. Through our corner meetings, Monthly meetings, CBO's were guided on importance of Gramsabha and its benefits. They were made aware of their roles and responsibilities as members of various CBO's. Through our frequent meetings, discussion were held on Organic Farming and various issues namely Safe Drinking water, Water management, use of waste water and Nutritional garden, Soak pits and water recharge pits, Roads and Electricity, Housing and Sanitation, Drainage system, Cleanliness of the village's. They were encouraged to attain forthcoming Gramsabha with written application of their demands from Grampanchayat.

Description: As a result nearly hundred of men and women were present for the Gramsabha held on 15th August 2018. Many of them participated in the meeting and brought out current issues of the villages namely safe drinking water and Tap connection in the villages, Proper Roads and electricity, Housing and Sanitation, proper drainage system and Soak pits, water recharge pits, Drainage system, Cleanliness of the village's. Also various

agricultural schemes and governments entitlements were made known to the people.

For the first time number of women were present for the Women Special Gramsabha. Nearly 39 women from mission area participated in the Gramsabha and brought for the various current issues namely Safe Drinking water, Roads and Electricity, Housing and Sanitation. Women also demanded to have regular and sufficient water. Mrs. Vandana Mule raised her voice and threaten the members "If you don't provide water by Sunday, all the women will come with Handa Morcha" After much discussion Grampanchayat members decided to provide daily well water so people may have enough of water. It was a memorable day for the women, for the first time they attained Gramsabha and demanded for their rights in the Gramsabha. It was admirable that women are vibrant and active and they can solve many issues when they are united.

Likewise Men and Women participated all the Gramsabhas held at respective time and raised their voices for their rights, needs of the people and current issues of the villages. As Support system we have created Village development Committee. It motivates and encourages Farmers Groups, Water friends, SHG members to participate in the Gramsabha with written application.

Result: In the history of the Group Grampanchayat Panchala, nearly 39 Women participated in the special Gramsabha and 155 Men and Women participated in the village Gramsabha and submitted 70 written applications for Safe Drinking Water, Drainage Clearance, Well

Construction, Housing and proper road in the villages etc. They presented their application systematically to the Gramsabha and they were recorded positively. It was a unique endeavor that Women actively participated in the Gramsabha and stood courageously for their rights. They also were made known various agricultural schemes and Government entitlements.



4. JEEVAN – EMPOWERMENT ANIMATION

Supported by: Caritas India

COMMUNITY ACHIEVED THE RESULT:

- There are 30 CBOs in the program villages among 15 CBOs are actively supported community to raise their voice on 78 issues in the local governance by participating in the Gram Sabha.
- It was difficult for tribal community to write suitable application due to the lack of awareness and standard education level. But now 15 Local volunteers are capable for helping the community to write the application on village issues and departments through the political education process.
- CBOs and the people group solved 27 local issues and initiated for taking the follow-ups on rest of 61 issues on the applications they submitted in the governance.
- VDC took regular follow up of their application regarding the Special Power supply in their village for water supply and finally they received this facility.
- Anganwari Construction completed in Ramtek village, for this anganwari center community had submitted application in Gram sabha in November 2018. Since they were taking follow-up and finally at the end of the February 2019 the construction work has completed.

- Local governance had no fund for the water supply section. Community initiated to solve this issue with the support of VDC and Farmers group those who contributed in manual work of Pipeline fitting in Dobanbarda village and now they have been getting safe drinking water at home.
- Community visited to panchayat and solved the issue of drinking water during drought by enforced local governance to provide the drinking during the summer season.
- In Ramtek village classes of the children under 5 years age group are now regular in new constructed Anganwari center. Community struggle and enforced governance to build new Anganwari center in the village and finally they solved this issue.
- Due to the absence of Veterinary hospital and care 19 animals expired by unknown disease. Then community created movement and enforced governance to avail the facility for livestock and finally government constructed Veterinary hospital in Badnapur village.
- Finally Dobanbarda villagers receive the ownership of the local Lake which was under control of outsider after the community movement and with the support of Sarpanch.



- 2950 Individuals participated actively in the 28 Gram Sabha, they raised 78 issues and solved 27 during this reporting period from the program village.
- Where there was difficult to have common Gram Sabha previously, community demanded for special Gram Sabha in the village too. And first time Special Women Gram Sabha conducted in KulanganaKhurd village in which 125 women actively participated in discussion and within week solved 3 village level issues.
- Through project we had conducted various demos on Gram Sabha but now community self initiated and conducted 3 rallies and awareness program in the program villages.
- Community solved the issue of irregularity in work and payment of MREGS by taking stand against RozgarSevak and dismissed him on his job through the Gram Sabha in Somwarkheda village. 2239 beneficiaries received work through the MREGS among the 3133 demands during this reporting period. It helped to reduced migration up to 55% from the program villages.
- 112 new job cards received in the community and now they are engage in the MREGS work and did not migrate this season.
- 9 new community assets created through MREGS in the program village those are Road, Check dam, Farm Pond, village lake etc.
- Long awaited issue of Anganwari worker recruitment in Kulangana village has solved in special Gram Sabha through lucky draw.
- Tribal community naturally feel shy to express themselves, but after the motivation by JEA 11 Farmers from Badnapur and Vastapur participated in Agriculture Exhibition first time at Amravati organized by the ATMA and Agriculture department.
- Now there are 6 Women lead farmers are facilitating to other women farmers for the farming. They come together to share the knowledge and experience to each other.
- 26 Women farmers are engaged with the farming and promoting food crop in their land. They are facilitated by the women farming facilitator for preparing repellent and growth promoters for their crop.
- 113 Farmers (61 new and 52 old those were in first phase) are practicing Mix cropping and promoting indigenous seed in their land.
- 6 types of traditional seed promoted by farmers during this reporting period such as Milo, Red Rise, Chilli, Red Pulse, Bajri and Corn.
- Around 37 quintal traditional seed is stored at farmers for regular use for sowing and eating too.
- There are 17 nutritional garden promoted by the community which use as fresh vegetable in the program villages.

- Through the networking with Agriculture department 417 farmers received Seed for sowing.
- 213 farmer tested soil sample and received Soil Testing Card first time by the motivation of JEA and support of Agriculture department.
- 112 household received financial support of each 10000/- for their vanished (for Cyclone affects as their houses and shed fallen down) in rainy season.
- After the intervention of VDC group 37 ration card holders started receiving Kerosene through PDS system.
- 15 farmers received Oil Engine and PUC pipes by the tribal project office. Amount of each section is around 334000/- but farmers received free.
- Due to the lack of proper staff, Children of Anganwari had not been getting sufficient and nutritious food, but now getting it by the 11 helpers those who selected through the Gram Sabha.
- 4 Farmers received Water well through the scheme of Project Office.
- 5 NGOs gather together for coordination and networking meeting during the reporting period. The NGOs are Pani Foundation, Water for People, CAIM, World Vision and Agriculture Department.
- 13 issues discussed in those meeting and 5 issues solved such as Drinking Water for Mozri, Dobanbarda and vastapur village.
- Through the networking with ATMA, facilitate for exposure visit for 9 farmers to PanjabraoKrushiVidyaoth Akola.
- 36 farmers have their livestock from they earn good income by selling milk.
- 41 farmers utilizing and earning by horticulture practice in Sosokheda, Nanduri, Ramtek, Vastapur and Badnapur village.
- 153 farmers received crop insurance through the networking with the Agriculture department.
- There are 113 farmers promoting sustainable agriculture practices including 61 new and 52 old.
- All 113 farmers are utilizing the natural resources for their land and cropping system in the program village.
- 27 farmers preparing and using bio manure for their land and crop in the program villages.

SABAL - Integrated farmers' livelihood project in the Korku tribal villages

Supported by: Caritas India

OUTCOME:

- For 3000 Korku households in Chikhaldara block of Amravati District (Maharashtra) food security is enhanced with diversification in food production and intake.
- 2:2500 Korku households have achieved protein self-sufficiency.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND RESULTS OF THE ACTIVITIES:

- We distributed 467 soil health cards in this year. 313 cards distributed with Sabal initiative and 154 soil health card distributed with the help of Pani Foundation.
- In this half year 313 farmers contributed around 10800 rupees for soil testing of their land.
- 8112 liter Cow urine collected from 7 cattle shade in project area.
- 7934 liter cow urine collected by farmer for SAP practice in SABAL distributed drums in 33 villages.
- 311 quintal makka shelled by makka Sheller by 243 families.
- We got 10100 Rupees local contribution after maize Sheller distribution.
- Sukhram Sawalkar used 10 Trolley Cow dunk in 1 hector of land.
- 39 Kg Chili Powder sold by the pulveriser unit in this month. And now working on more production and marketing strategies.
- 3000 Korku communities, especially women and children, will have access to institutional nutritional services and schemes.
- Nutrition care and support institutions and local governance systems are made more responsive and accountable with the initiative of Korku collectives and advocacy.
- One Sag bag dam and Farm Stone bund constructed by 42 villagers at Chunkhadi village voluntarily. 7 farmers got benefit of this dam.
- In this year Jai Muthva Baba farmer group generated Rs. 2300/- from millet mill.
- Total 1022 Saplings are distributed in nursery and 2220 local contribution collected.
- Members of Farmer Field School participated in the 4 Meetings and discussed about the better cropping system for Rabi season Season.
- 59 Litters Cow Urine sold Raw Material Collection centre.
- The members of the unit are keeping their record well. As per their record they gave service for 280 KG and earn 1120 rupees.



- About 322 Kg grains floured on the Chichati unit and earned 1288 rupees.
- 212 beneficiaries are eating Green vegetable such as ladyfinger, cucumber, bitter guard, Coriander etc. from Anganwadi Nutrition Garden in 9 Villages.
- All structures of soil and water conservation works are filled with water which was made in Dec to Mar 19 periods.
- Mr. Shaligram Bethekar got 5 kg production of Ragi millet.
- In Kharif 78 farmers Got Benefited of Food Resource centre. Total 200 kg kutki, 50kg sawa, Ragi 1kg, Rala- 1kg, Jigni-50kg and vegetables seed and return ratio is 150%.
- In this year 18 Farmers started weekly market in project villages because of JVS SABAL intervention.
- 23 farmers produced 247quintal vermin compost manure of Barugavhan and Salita village
- In Rabi season Farmers participated in 77 Demo plots with 90.5 Acres of land and took production of 476 quintal of wheat and 78 farmers practiced SAP in 59.5 Acres of land and took 253 quintal production of Gram in 3 villages and in 11 Acres 20 quintal productions of Tuar and Jigni.
- In Kharif season 66 demo plot farmers used 2 Dose of Jeevamrut, 1 Dose of cytosine and 1 Dose of Lamit after 15-20 days gap.
- In this year 562 farmers practiced mix cropping food crop pattern.
- In Rabi 2020 Season 46 farmers used Jeevamrut, 34-cytosine INM and 51 farmers used IPM.

- 418 farmers sowed food crop and millet instead of soybean (Cash crop).
- 334 farmer sowed millet in their farm.
- In Kharif season 56 farmers sowed millet in mix cropping pattern.
- In Rabi Season 74 farmers used Yellow sticky and Feromin traps for pest control and they saw good result near about 80% of pest control from this traps.
- In project area not only 618 families are eating Forest based food but they are selling in the weekly market. (Bamboo shoot, Mushroom, Chirota, Doda bhaji. etc..)
- 86 families of project area started their own Nutrition garden.
- Mr. Sabulal Lala Bethekar from Madizadap had supported by providing the seed for vegetable garden last year. This year he initiated and started vegetable cultivation in his land with self-support. He is selling vegetables in Khadimal weekly market
- In Rabi 2019-2020 season 63 farmer got 13 quintal production of sawa millet and 25 quintal production of kutki millet and other farmers a waited.
- In Rabi 2019-2020 season 66 demo plots 38 people seed processing and 49 farmer seed germination test of Gram and Wheat seeds.
- In Kharif 2019 season 151 farmer of project area sowed seed after Seed testing and seed processing
- In Kharif 2019 season 48 farmers got total production in demo plot details -46 quintal jawar, Makka -34, udid-5, Mung- 5 quintal- seismic
- In this month 18 vermin compost unit digging by people voluntarily.
- In this year 598 families of project area are cached and eat, Prawns, Crabs and fishes from River, pond and Check Dam.
- In this year reporting 259 Children ate 1139 eggs from Sabal poultry unit. 236 Chicks got from Sabal poultry unit.
- We Redistributed poultry unit at Barugavhan and Chunkhadi village beneficiaries and got 22 chicks and 20 eggs from the poultry unit.
- Functionalize total 9 nutrition garden, spinach, ladyfinger, cucumber, bitter guard, and Coriander available total 5 types of different vegetables, developed and introduce seasonal plans for nutrition garden. Total 4550 rupees vegetable used for ANC/PNC Mother and Children diet.
- 27 Family started eating Drumstick Vegetable from the saplings that were distributed in 2017.
- Vaccinators training program details - total 30 Poshan Mitra trained initiated the program from 9th Dec.
- 512 household level nutrition gardens initiated and 5 types of vegetables and consumption.
- 30 Poshan Mitra trained by Animal Husbandry Department. First Aid kit also given.
- 7000 rupees cost medicines distributed by Animal Husbandry department in Biba village.
- Chobita-14 Bhandum-4, Salita-3, Awagad-3, Barugavhan-7, Bodu-3, Lakheveda-4, Bicchukheda-1, Ghana-1,



Khandukheda-1, Rahu-5, Sumita-3, Hirda-3 and Navalgaon-4 children. Total 55 children gained weight and under normal category from SAM/MAM category after Sattu powder feeding.

- 9 Children of Ghana village are came Normal Catogray in SAM/MAM Catogray.
- 16 Children those were in MAM category are in Normal category now.
- 11 Children of Bordha & Ghana village are come SAM, MAM into Normal Catogray.
- In project area children's attendance increased by 89 % after toys distribution in Anganwadi centers.
- 78 ANC/PNC Mother enrolled in Anganwadi centre after JVS Sabal intervention.
- 30 children re-enrolled in Anganwadi centre after JVS Sabal intervention.
- 1 Child of Hirda village refers in RH Churni.
- During the reporting period 11 children referred to Katkumbh Primary health center from Ghana village those are safe now.
- In this year 5 children referred by 4 Bhumka
- Mother and child care committee supported to refer 7 ANC mother and 12 children in RH, Amravati and Nagpur.
- In this reporting period we referred 23 children to RH, PHC, and District Hospital etc.
- After Protein powder distribution 127 children weight gained.



- 50 applications are Submitted for the seeds(Wheat) From ATMA
- 18 Women farmers got 540 kg gram seeds from ATMA (Amounted Rs. 36000-)
- 10-farmers of Sumita, 13-farmers of Barugavhan village got vermin compost Unit from forest department after Sabal intervention.
- In three villages (Salita, Bhandum and Sumita) hand pumps sanctioned / approved after Sabal group proposal submitted in gramsabha.
- Jan 2019 in tribal food festival Korku delegation submitted memorandum to Mr. Ramesh Mawaskar Food & Supply Commissioner Amravati Dist.
- People of Biba, Barugavhan, Khadimal, Hatru Grampanchayat Submitted 13 proposals/memorandum submitted in Gramsabha. 413 people participated in gramsabha.
- After submission of memorandum in gramsabha in Rahu village finally Anganwadi repairing work completed.
- In this year 682 people of project area worked voluntarily and made 14 Soil and water conservation structures in project area. Rs. 1,30,944/-worth work done voluntarily. Total 682 people participated in this work.
- In Biba & Rahu village 24 women got poultry Unit from veterinary department because of JVS SABAL intervention. Per unit 20 hens and cock.
- In Sumita village total 40 meter C.C Road work completed for which last year on 26 JAN 2018 people of Sumita had submitted memorandum in gramsabha.



- 3 farmers got cattle shade Scheme after Sabal intervention in Bordha village. (Lalaji Subaji Kasde, Basu Babulal Kasdekar, Chanu Nandram Dhikar)
- 78 women got Ujwala gas scheme after JVS Sabal intervention.
- After submission of memorandum in gramsabha, farmers got 1000 sapling in Madizadap Village and 1000 saplings in Chunkhadi village.
- 2 farmer got spray pump from Tribal Project Office Dharni for Rs. 100/- on subsidies because of JVS SABAL Intervention.
- 2 Farmers from Bordha village got 250 each fruits saplings from Agriculture department after JVS Sabal Intervention.
- After memorandum submission in gramsabha of Ektai village farmers got 1500 saplings. (1000 fruits sapling and 500 forest based)
- 3 There was no electricity in Ektai village. SABAL team facilitated for the Electricity and the work is started in the village.
- 38 CBO leaders checked the quality of Anganwadi and School food quality.
- 15 farmers received Solar Pump Scheme through the intervention of JVS Sabal team.
- 105 people of Awagad, Barugavhan- 120, Biba-100, Barugavhan-56 people submitted memorandum in Gramsabha based on different issues.
- Biba and Chunkhadi food resource center providing good service to the Farmers groups



6. Integrated Family Development Programme

Supported by: SAFP Canada

The Family Development programme provides financial assistance to thousands of impoverished families throughout India in becoming self-reliant. In partnering with these families, The FDP supports impoverished families in reaching their full potential and achieve success through key elements such as income generating initiatives, ongoing local support, and individualized family interaction and needs assessments and facilitation, resulting in quality outcome.

Staff Meeting

The FFT (Family Facilitation Team) meeting was conducted at the end of every month. The main objective of the FFT meeting was to discuss about the proper implementation of the project in the working areas, the various problems faced by the partner families in doing the small



business initiatives as well as focusing on the overall family development. During this meeting we could discuss the work that is being accomplished and left undone. The problems faced by the animators in the field due to the noncooperation of the family, community, society etc also other social issues were being discussed and together with the support of one another we could find solutions for the same.

The animators also submitted the plan for the next month in the meeting. These meetings helped us to become more aware of our roles and responsibilities, transparency and accountability. It also helped us for the effective management and monitoring of positive results with the families.

Preparation of the letter to the Donors:

The letters are written twice in a year. It helps the donor to understand more deeply about the partner family and how their contribution helped the family to achieve their goals. In the month of April to June we have written 325 letters to the donors and in the month of December 285 Christmas cards were sent by the partner families. The beneficiaries could express their love and gratitude for their generosity through their letters.

Regional Level Meeting

Regional level meetings were being conducted by the coordinator in Paratwada, Malkapur and Kusumkot region three times in the year 2019 - 2020. We provided in-depth knowledge on various topics such as health, organic farming / kitchen garden, herbal medicines, Waste management / vermin compost, awareness on government schemes, implication of bad habits, gender, education, human rights, women empowerment, Planning, budgeting, small business initiatives, leadership training etc. These trainings helped bonding among the families and help them to motivated and increase their level of confidence to attain their targeted goals.

Center Level Meetings

Center level meetings and trainings were being conducted by the animators twice in a year in 21 centers. They conducted sessions on Primary health care and various illnesses, Self help group, Acupuncture, Cupping, Income generating activities, Education, Health, Local self government, Social Welfare schemes etc. These meetings helped the women to understand better and actively participate in every activity as it was being conducted in their own village. This motivated them to share their knowledge with other women as well as practice at home. There is a positive behavioral change we can see in them.



EDP training

The New family orientation and Entrepreneurship Development Training Programme was conducted on 26th of October 2019 in Jeevan Vikas Sanstha, Amravati in Kusumkot region at Dayasagar Social Centre. About 22 new active families took part in the training programme. Mr. Alto Antony the Regional Programme officer SAFPI addressed the beneficiaries and introduced himself and the purpose of his visit. Fr. Benjamin the Director of Jeevan Vikas Sanstha too spoke about the purpose of the training programme and explained about the project. Mr. Raju and Mr. Sumit who were invited to conduct the Entrepreneurship Development training programme of the

day. On this day we conducted Three training programmes namely on Animal husbandry, Production of Mushroom cultivation and preparation of Soybean milk. These are very applicable and effective income generation activities in this region. Mr. Sumit conducted the session on Animal husbandry. He explained in detail about the goat rearing, cow rearing, poultry farming, and Honey bee cultivation. Sr. Jenifer the FDP coordinator conducted the session on "New family orientation. This helped the beneficiaries to know about the project, its main aims and objectives, its function, about the benefactors, and also the functions of the NGO's at the local level. The beneficiaries were happy to know about the project and came to know about their responsibilities of being the part of the project.



Family visits, Fund Disbursement and Income Generation Activities

The coordinator and animators conducted monitoring visit to the families with the planned purpose. The yearly planning was done with the partner families in the month of January, February, March 2019 and around 285 beneficiaries did the fund withdrawal to begin the small business initiatives. Some of them have continued the same

and others have brought changes in the planned activities due to the problems and unsuitable conditions in the family and surroundings. The fund was given for the livestock rearing, small business, infrastructure, education and health purpose. Regular monitoring visits by the coordinator and animator were being conducted in order to verify the success of the income generation activities and family development. These livelihood initiatives have brought gradual development in the family.



International Women's day

International Women's Day was celebrated in Amravati Diocesan Social Service Society on 12th of March 2020. Mrs. Sangeeta Javanjal (Vidhan Parishad Mahila Adhyakshika) Mrs. Kalpana Kasdekar (Extension officer from Achalpur Panchayat Samiti), Mrs. Ramdhulari Athawale Sapanch, were the invited guests of the day. Fr. Benjamin, Fr. Maria Francis were also present for the celebration. The programme was lead by Sr. Jenifer SU and animator Mrs. Chanda. The day's programme began with lighting of the lamp and Prayer. The invited guests were warmly welcomed with the bouquet of flowers and shawl. Fr. Benjamin explained about the Save a Family Plan



Besides these activities the animators and the coordinator have the ongoing responsibilities such as, selection of the new families and preparation, writing progress of the completed families, record keeping such as online updating in the DDMS (website) bank details, uploading letters, yearly planning, Updating of the bank books, Bank work, updating handbooks, files, monthly planning and reporting, conducting village level meetings when necessary, fund withdrawal of the beneficiaries, Account opening of the new beneficiaries, account closing of the completed families, special gift / housing gift planning, general correspondence with Save a family plan India etc.



project and the work that is undertaken by Jeevan Vikas Sanstha in all three regions that is Paratwada, Kusumkot and Malkapur. Through his speech he motivated the women. We had cultural programme like skits, dances, motivational songs about women and speech from the women. The resource persons Mrs. Sangeeta, Mrs. Kalpana and Mrs. Ramdhulari too inspired women through their motivational speech. The women have the capacity to hold the family and she is always multitasking. If a woman has managed to bring up her family she can gain the whole world. Only one needs the inner strength and the faith in oneself. They explained to them about their life stories that have brought them to be what they are today. Therefore as women we need to endure and persevere in life. The programme ended with the lunch for everyone.

7. COVID-19 Response

Jeevan Vikas Sanstha has been active in relief works and charity works ever since the dreaded Covid-19 virus began to spread in India in the month of March 2020. We concentrated mainly on the displaced migrants who lost their job and are left without daily food for their survival.

1. Strategy for JVS Partners:

- Mobilized local dry food grain resources from the Community
- All the local based institutions were appealed to do the Act of Charity in a ways that they can do.

2. Main Initiatives taken by JVS

- Requested the generous people to contribute dry food grains for the migrant and poor people
- Collected the dry food grains from the people

3. Outcome of the Initiatives taken by the partners

- With the help of local Church and community, we could collect dry food grain for the poor and deserving people
- In the first month we could collect food grains and distribute them to 250 poor people and also distributed sanitary items to them.

4. Innovative ways of response

- Appealed to several authorities and requested them to contribute something generously towards the poor people who are adversely affected with lockdown specially the old and poor who are deprived of ration from the ration shops.



JVS served for the community during the COVID 19. Provided ration kit to 520 families in which covered around 2600 people. Caritas India supported for 340 families and for rest of the 180 families received support by the local leaders and volunteers. At first we did the survey and collected information of the quarantine migrant people those are living in the schools and not allowed to stay at their home for 14 days

- Purchasing the material
- Packing the Food Kit.
- Marking in distribution place to stand beneficiary in the line and safe distance.
- Transportation from pick up and drop place.
- Taking support from local leaders and PRI members for distribution

While carrying out these relief works JVS followed :

- For Community:-**
 - Marking on 1.5 meter to stand the beneficiary in line.
 - Beneficiaries should cover their mouth with mask or cloths.
 - Informed about the precautions on COVID 19 before distribution
 - Keep Food kit on distance and let them take one by one, do not give hand to hand.
- For Staff:-**
 - Use mask on mouth
 - Use Sanitizers time to time
 - Maintain Safe distance while packing and distribution.
 - Use hand glosses while distribution.

CHALLENGES

While distribution to maintain the safe distance as social distancing but local leaders and PRI members support to maintain it.

- Travelling from one location to another in lockdown.
- Find out the neediest families in the community. Because everyone tries to become beneficiary in getting free.
- Misunderstanding in the community if some families do not get the food kit.
- Difficult to get facilities for hand wash all the times.

LEARNINGS

- Local leaders and PRI members support creates cooperative atmosphere in the community.
- We have to follow guideline for our safety.
- Community must know the accessories they have been getting.
- Community should from where they have getting the food kit.
- Community still not aware about precautions on COVID 19, so it was helpful to redirect them while distribution.
