- **Preparation of the letter to the Donors:** The letters are written every year. - Cluster Level Meeting: These meetings help the women to understand better and actively participate in every activity as it is being conducted in their own village. - **EDP training:** This training program helps the beneficiaries to know about the project, its main aims and objectives, its function, about the benefactors, and also the functions of the NGO's at the local level.
- Family visits, Fund Disbursement and Income Generation Activities: Regular monitoring visits by the coordinator are being conducted in order to verify the success of the income generation activities and family development. These livelihood initiatives have brought gradual development in the family.

SAMARTH : BUILDING RESILIENCE FOR WOMEN-HEADED DISTRESSED

RURAL HOUSEHOLDS OF MAHARASHTRA

SUPPORTED BY : CARITAS INDIA

The Samarth project launched in March 2021, during same time the second wave of the corona-19 Pandemic began to spread. The phases of lockdown were carried out in Maharashtra to control the spread of pandemic. The series of lockdowns led to the poverty of communities and hunger. Second wave of epidemic left a horrible tail many of peoples falling illness, many of lose their lives and many of peoples lost their works so the poverty and hunger to begin. All economic sectors were affected and poor communities suffered severely. The second wave of the Corona pandemic lasted four month which began in march-2021 and ended in july-2021.

In August 2021 when the second wave of the pandemic had become less intensive and the government gradually reduced the restrictions. Samarth started to implement the main activities in the communities for enabling and capacitating the farmer's widows, vulnerable women, women headed families and distressed women. Team of Samarth not only works for the economic well-being of widows. But also help them to achieve more respectable social standing and acceptance in the communities. Therefore, Samarth used befriending and strategy building the confidence of vulnerable women and strengthening. Women from farmer's suicide victims' families are formed into groups so that they released their burdens of networking and communications. Government has several programmes both livelihood and welfare oriented; they are sensitised to government schemes and processes. While they assisted to gain self-reliance in terms of economic needs of family, they also supported to participate as capacitated and empowered. Most vulnerable women helped with seed money for starting micro-enterprises, Pretty trades and linked them with government schemes to sustain their trades. Samarth team gave all necessary psycho-social support to all needy women for achieved composure and extended families thereby ending their social and economic isolation.

- 1.1. At least 210 women-headed micro-enterprises, petty trades will have been initiated for increasing monthly income by at least Rs.4, 000.
- 210 widows have been finalized for income generation activities.
- 100 widows have been received seed money support to initiate micro-enterprises, petty trades to increasing income.
- **49 vulnerable families** have increased their average monthly income of Rs.3846 of livelihood supported by SAMARTH.
- 167 widows were helped apply for financial support of entrepreneurship promotion under MSRLM programme and 57 widows received support of Rs.20, 000 of the government of Maharashtra.
- 18 tribe widows were helped to submit applications for scheme benefit of ITDP. Once it is approved, they will get Rs.50000 each to set up income generation activities and microenterprises (like Kirana shop, sewing machine, beauty parlour) under Nucleus budget.

- 23 widows linked to District industry centre for technical entrepreneurship development program and received Rs.1000 stipend, training and certificate. Directorate of Industry helps them for loan facility for start-up micro-enterprises under Chief Minister employment generation program (CMEGP)
- 6 vulnerable women-headed families finalized for receiving support of Rs.30000 to establishing micro-enterprises units, petty trades for income generation activity of vatsalya Mission.
- 13 family's members of suicide victims are linked to free of cost skill development training under DDUGKY. Once they complete training, they will get employments and self-employments opportunity under ministry of rural and skill development government of Maharashtra.
- 9 widow's children/widows were applied of MSCIT training under ICDS of Z. P. administration of these 5 widows' children/women completed training.
- **06 widows were** helped to submitted applications to social welfare department. Once it's approved, they will get Xerox machine, Chakki and stall shade under disability welfare schemes of the Z.P administration.
- 6 widows received support from micro finance bank of Rs.20000 to expanded micro-enterprises activities.
- 28 widows expanded their livelihood activities by profit received by income generation activities.
- 20 widow's families purchased assets for household through profit.
- 1.2. At least 400 women heads of families will be linked with government schemes specifically for women, farm widows or designed for micro-enterprises.
 - 173 widows applied for widow pension scheme benefits. All of them started receiving monthly pension of Rs.1000.
 - 62 widows were helped to submit applications for with benefits of government housing schemes of these 54 widows received Rs.1, 38,000 each for constructing their house.
 - 10 farm suicide families benefited through networking meeting with likeminded organization of Habitat for humanity. Each of these will receive of Rs. 150000. In the month of April housing of constriction will start.
 - 73 widows were helped to apply for emergency widow financial support under National financial benefit scheme of these 45 widows received Rs. 20.000 each
 - SAMARTH secured the future of **109 widows**' families by linked them to e-shram card scheme. They will receive old age pension of Rs.3000 per month Rs.500000 Health insurance and Rs.200000 as accidental insurance or compensation under Ministry of labour & employment government of India.
 - 215 widows were submitted applications for benefits of Child Protection Scheme. Once it is approved the children of widows will start getting a monthly stipend of Rs.1100
 - **26 vulnerable women** received benefit of Rs.5000 and safety kit under Maharashtra Building and Other construction worker's welfare Board.
 - 14 widows helped to registered for Ayushyaman bharat health account (ABHA) they will be receiving benefit of free medical surgeries or up to Rs.500000/ under Ministry of health and welfare government of India.
 - 59 widows received rations kits under food security scheme.
 - Widows submitted 1465 applications for getting schemes benefits of various existing of government, Semi-government and agencies welfare and development schemes.

- 1.3. 20 Organisations / groups of women-in-distress (farm widows and deserted women) will have been raised and strengthened.
 - 323 widows are trained and aware about income generation program, pretty trades, and microenterprises through trainings with DIC, MCED, UMED,
 - 22 collectives of widows formed at village cluster level each groups having 11 members
 - **Formed 4 women** federation of 44 members at district level.
 - 5 widow's farmers self-help groups are formed each of groups having 11 members.
 - **89 widows** aware of domestic violence by Taluka Vidhi seva samiti.
 - 147 widows were trained on domestic and women security acts with the help of trainings organised by Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) of Women and Child Welfare department.
 - 13 community-based organization are greatly aware about income generation program through networking with likeminded organizations.
 - 5 farmers' widows groups trained on agro-base scheme and will be linked with ATMA, MAVIM, MSRLM, and NABARD.
 - 386 were trained on government schemes and training on application filling.
 - 22 women CBO leaders are capacited on credit management and linkage building through trainings.

PROJECT: PROVIDING ESSENTIAL FOOD MATERIALS TO THE COVID-19 VICTIM FAMILIES WITHIN THE DISTRICT OF AMRAVATI, MAHARASHTRA STATE, INDIA

INTRODUCTION:

Covid – 19 has profoundly changed the lives of many. It has caused tremendous human suffering challenging the people's wellbeing. The pandemic has increased people's anxiety and worry. The vulnerable and disadvantaged groups have impacted more severely as they had no options to fulfill their basic needs. The situation in isolated tribal villages is grimmer where apart from the fear of Covid-19, people are also dealing with hunger struggling to fulfill the basic needs. The tribal communities in this Melghat region are vulnerable as they don't have proper homes, adequate income or sufficient resources. They are on the brink of starvation. They suffer from various problems such as Lack of Access to Food and other basic needs. Many of them have almost exhausted their monthly ration supplies and most of them do not have access to avail rations due to lack of awareness. The children would rely on midday meals from schools which have also stopped since many schools have been shut down due to the pandemic. People who migrate to work on construction sites or brick kilns have been cut off from their livelihood as they are not able to move due to travel restrictions. As compared to cities, their access to food is severely restricted. At this juncture the proposed project has helped to respond to the basic needs of the families and give temporary relief to the people and has effectively provided them with sustenance.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

The immediate objective of the proposed project was to provide temporary relief to **310 tribal** and **Dalit households** through the supply of ration kits which contained essential dry daily provisions. The long-term objective is to help 310 most underprivileged families to survive and find a job for their daily food in the near future once the COVID -19 comes to an end.

PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

The staff of Jeevan Vikas Sanstha consulted the local authorities to identify the people who need this help the most. A Survey was conducted in ten villages namely Wazzar, Dhomni Phata, Nimkund, Kohana, Jamli, Bela, Sosarda, Belkheda, Gondvihir and Mueiphatha. These villages are located in the Melghat region of Maharashtra. The local authorities helped us to identify the most needy and vulnerable group. All of them belong to tribal and Dalit communities. With the

financial help received from Manos Unidas we could reach out to 310 families where no Government or NGO has been working until date. The food kits consisted of Rice 5kg, Wheat flour 10kg, Tea powder 250gm, Sugar 2kg, Chili Powder 500gm, Soap 2 pieces, Cooking Oil 2 liters and Masks 5. These food kits helped them to feed their families at least for a month at the same time relieve them from worry and anxiety.

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PROJECT : INTERIM PANDEMIC RELIEF RESPONSE IN SABAL

The emergency relief programme was implemented in the same villages where the Sabal programme is implemented since last 5 years. The area is well known to the team; therefore, it was easy for the Sabal team for identifying the beneficiaries as per the proposed parameters. With regard to the identification of the persons with comorbidities the help was sought from the medical representatives and Anganwadi workers. The prioritization of the mothers and children were done based on the available list with the Sabal community facilitators.

PROJECT: PROVIDING ESSENTIAL FOOD MATERIALS TO THE COVID-19 VICTIM FAMILIES WITHIN THE MISSION DIOCESE OF AMRAVATI

SUPPORTED BY: MISSIO, Aachen

Following the completion of a 6 month's project to the covid-19 victims, Jeevan Vikas Sanstha, once again applied to MISSIO, Aachen, for another project as a continued support to the starving families. The project was sanctioned by Missio and Euros 45.000,00 was sanctioned to provide food grains to 300 poor families within the diocese of Amravati.

Selection of Beneficiaries: Even though there were several hundreds of needy people, we had to limit the number keeping in mind the most vulnerable people under various criteria as per the project application. Thus the selections of 300 families were done with the help of local parish priests and the staff of JVS in different locations within the diocese of Amravati. We recognized 11 most needed locations where people are suffering most. From among them we selected 300 families who were denied of their basic food materials during the last few months. The following chart will show the number of beneficiaries in different locations.

Project implementation

The proper implementation of the project took place after finalizing the beneficiary list with the local partners. The list of the selected beneficiaries from each parish was approved by the JVS team after verifying the real life situation in different locations.

The next step was to finalize the food items that are essential to each family. Thus after consulting with the partners and the beneficiaries, we decided to purchase basic food items such as wheat flour, rice, tea powder, chilli powder, sugar, pulses, edible oil etc. Various vendors were asked to submit the cost estimate and after studying the quotations submitted by different provision vendors, we gave order as per the quantity mentioned in the project application and approved by the agency. In fact, the prices of major food items had gone higher than what was budgeted in the project. Therefore we decided to purchase and supply food materials for two months together, instead of every month so that some money could be saved from transportation. Thus the money saved by transportation was used for supply of extra food items.

The packing of the food kits were done by different labour with the help of coordinator and other staff of JVS. They made sure that every kit contained exact quantity of provisions. After packing the food items it was separated as per the number of beneficiaries in each village.

Project impact

Around 1800 people from 300 starving families of 10 parishes/villages were given new life and good health through the project. The situation was very critical for these families and at the completion of this project many of them are able to find some daily income for their survival. Due to the distribution of the food kits to the neediest people of these villages, 300 households were able to get temporary relief from their suffering. They were able to search for alternative works. People who lost their daily jobs due to the Corona virus and subsequent lock-down were in a very miserable situation. Such people benefitted from this project most. They expressed their gratitude to Missio, Aachen and all its benefactors for their generous and kind good will and solidarity with the suffering humanity. As a whole we can say that the expected outcome of the project is 100 % successful.
